



DISTRICT SIX TIM TEAM PARTICIPATES IN STATEWIDE MEETING HOSTED AT SUNTRAX TEST FACILITY

The District Six Traffic Incident Management (TIM) Team recently attended the All-Districts Traffic Incident Management Meeting held March 29-31 at the SunTrax Test Facility Toll Operations Center in Auburndale, FL.

The meeting was hosted by Central Office and gathered TIM Teams from across the state to discuss key topics impacting the incident management community. It was scheduled across three days and consisted of program discussions, vendor demonstrations and a tour of the SunTrax Center. The first day covered an update on Road Ranger funding, an overview of the SharePoint site, a discussion about the latest Road Ranger safety initiatives

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and adjourned with a District Roundtable that allowed attendees to talk about the events happening in their respective regions. The second day continued with an update on Road Ranger contracts and trainings. It was followed by three vendor demonstrations and concluded with a tour of the state-of-the-art facility that is being developed for the testing of innovative and emerging transportation technologies. The last day went over administrative topics such as the Quality Assurance Review Process, updates to the Strategic Plan and concluded with an open discussion session. The District Six TIM Team came back energized by the meeting and the topics discussed. They reported

several valuable lessons and takeaways from the information that was given by Central Office as well as by interaction with their peers. District Six looks forward to participating in more events that bring

TSM&O OFFICE SUPPORTS PALMETTO EXPRESS CAPACITY PROJECT



The District Six Transportation Systems Management and Operations (TSM&O) Office is supporting FDOT's latest capacity improvement project on State Road (SR) 826/Palmetto Expressway.

The project began in March 2022 and is modifying major portions of the facility to improve its travel time reliability and benefit all drivers. It will add a permanent, non-tolled general purpose lane, enhance access into the express lanes system and improve the geometry of the expressway and the frontage road system. Construction will

last approximately 2.5 years and the District's TSM&O Office is providing operational and incident management support during this critical time. The Office is using its suite of traveler information resources to alert drivers of traffic changes on the road and has adjusted Road Ranger schedules to provide coverage during major closures. The TSM&O Office is working closely with the construction team to identify additional areas of support to ensure motorist safety during this time. 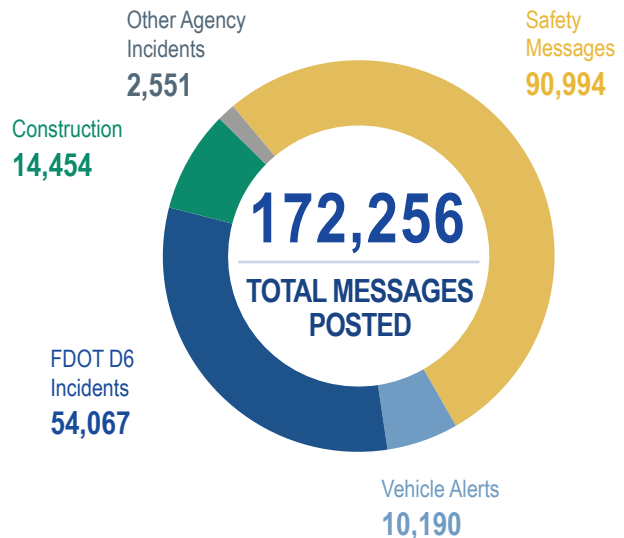
