goal, District Six created personalized video testimonials from members of the Road Ranger and Incident Response Vehicle fleet who talked about their roles both on the field and at home. The video testimonials played a key role in humanizing first responders in the public arena and were integrated as part of the public outreach campaign to

support the event. The campaign consisted of seven-day social media postings, public service announcements, program website updates, brochure distributions, and statewide news articles.

The District Six TIM Team is committed to supporting the initiatives that keep our roadways safe. From creating safety campaigns for CRSW to hosting training courses and improving roadway operations, the team works with national and

FHWA HOSTS TRAIN-THE-TRAINER SESSIONS IN SUPPORT OF NATIONAL CRSW

The District Six Traffic Incident Management (TIM) Team worked with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) to offer its Train-the-Trainer (TtT) course to the local incident response community in southeast Florida.

FHWA provided the course as an additional measure to support the national Crash Responder Safety Week hosted each year. The eight-hour course focuses on educating established TIM trainers on the latest safety protocols and procedures. It equips trainers with the necessary knowledge to educate their fellow TIM team members in their local state or region. It is strategically developed by responders for responders, so the information is disseminated and received in a way everyone can understand.

The virtual course was offered to all states across four time zones. It served as an additional effort to promote responder safety as part of the national initiative.


