The videos are approximately 30-seconds each and were developed to raise awareness about the incident management services provided by the District.

The videos inform drivers about who the incident responders are, the type of assistance they provide and how to safely request for help. Each video ends with a message about the "Move Over" Law to remind drivers what to do if they encounter an active traffic scene.

The main goal is to help drivers identify the multi-agency field personnel who provide these critical services and emphasize the importance of following traffic laws to promote roadway safety.

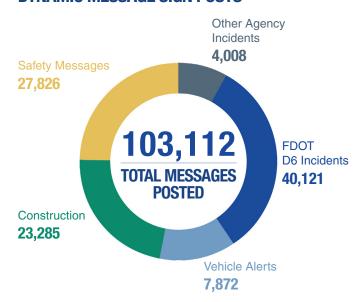
