Dedication

In March, at the beginning of the "Stay at Home" regulations, SIRV was respond to an average of 49 events per week. SIRV took advantage of the decreased traffic volume and, in September, responded to 253 events for a weekly average of 63.

<u>Cooperation</u>


- The Road Ranger team in Palm Beach was forced to reduce the number trucks patrolling the county. SIRV, helped pick up the slack by responding to and handling numerous crashes and lane blocking events without the benefit of a Road Ranger partner. During this period
- SIRV was able to maintain an average response time in Palm Beach of just over 12 minutes and there was no noticeable increase in the average duration of lane blockages.

Interagency Events

This 1st quarter we had 10 RISC events, compared to 12 in the 4th quarter. SIRV was able to help ensure the events were handled quickly, safely and restoring normal traffic flow.






Miami-Dade County Traffic Volume Trends

(9-23-2019 - 9-29-2019 v/s 9-21-2020 - 9-27-2020)






Broward County Traffic Volume Trends





STARR Calls Per Month




STARR Average Arrival Time




MDX Updates

- Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the MDX TMC operations and the level of traffic on our roadway system has been impacted
 - Friday March 19th, the MDX TMC staff transitioned from a 3-person to a 2-person Operations to promote social distancing
 - Monday, April 6th, MDX eliminated Road Ranger service on SR 112 and SR 924 from 9pm to 5am
- MDX Asset Management Contract expired on July 1st:
 - Until a new contract is awarded, the MDX assets will be managed in-house
 - There will be separate companies doing some of the work that was previously handled by the Asset Management Company
