DISTRICT SIX HOSTS ROAD RANGER AND TMC OPERATIONS WORKSHOPS



The FDOT District Six Transportation Systems Management & Operations (TSM&O) Office recently hosted its Road Ranger and Transportation Management Center (TMC) Workshops. These meetings bring together traffic operators from the SunGuide TMC, Road Rangers, and Incident Response Vehicle (IRV)

These sessions are scheduled every year to reinforce the TIM Program's mission and goals. Traffic operators and field responders work under the

unifying goal of clearing incidents and promoting roadway safety every day. However, they play different roles and have a unique set of responsibilities to fulfill on and off the field. The workshops provide an opportunity for them to meet face to face in an open setting that promotes dialogue between all members. They are set up in a classroom style format and encourages Road Rangers, traffic operators, and IRV personnel to sit together and learn about each other's

role from the other person's perspective. District Six staff leads the meetings and covers pertinent issues related to the program. They also conduct role playing scenarios where traffic operators complete a series of mock field exercises and Road Rangers go through the steps of detecting, dispatching, and clearing traffic events from

the viewpoint of the SunGuide TMC.
The workshops have proven to be beneficial to the incident management program and the District has received excellent feedback from staff.

FDOT DISTRICT SIX UPGRADING VIDEO WALL AT THE TMC

The District Six TSM&O Office continuously looks for ways to improve program operations by upgrading the systems and equipment that monitor the roadways and manage traffic on a daily basis.

The District is in the process of replacing the video wall that is located inside of the SunGuide Transportation Management Center (TMC) because it reached its end-of-life cycle last fiscal year. The new video wall will have the latest in state-of-the-art technology such as Direct View Light-Emitting Diode (DVLED) display.

The District selected the new video wall technology after completing extensive research and reviewing various potential options. The project is slated for completion in June 2024.

The video wall plays a critical role in the regional traffic management process, presentation of performance measures, and promotes interagency communication at the TMC. The new technology will improve the overall display for all users and will ensure the TMC is future ready for years to come.

RISC STATS


