

DISTRICT SIX PARTICIPATES IN CRASH RESPONDER SAFETY WEEK



The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Six TSM&O Office participated in the Federal Highway Administration's (FHWA) Crash Responder Safety Week (CRSW) campaign in November 2025.

The District developed a series of initiatives to raise public awareness and improve driver behavior around active work zones in the field.

The goal is to humanize our field responders and put a face behind the uniform so that everyone can arrive home safely.

FHWA sponsors the campaign every year to remind motorists that responder safety is everyone's responsibility. It empowers state and district offices to highlight the brave men and women who work to keep our roadways safe every day. The goal is to humanize our field responders and put a

District Six launched a five-day social media campaign featuring short videos and testimonials from Road Rangers and Incident Response Vehicle Operators that followed FHWA's daily themes: Safety Starts with You, Driver Education, Responder Training, More than a Crash, and Slow Down, Move Over. In addition to its digital outreach, the District also shared public service announcements on dynamic message signs, published newsflash items, and participated in a community engagement event with Florida's Turnpike Enterprise.

The District Six TIM Team is committed to supporting the initiatives that promote responder safety. From creating public awareness campaigns for CRSW to optimizing vehicle fleets with the latest technology for increased visibility, the District is always working to provide the

DISTRICT SIX HOSTS JOINT MEETING FOR MIAMI-DADE AND BROWARD COUNTY TIM TEAMS

The Miami-Dade and Broward County Traffic Incident Management (TIM) Teams held their biannual joint meeting in October. These regional meetings provide a forum for partner agencies to meet face-to-face, share updates, and highlight the major initiatives impacting South Florida.

District Six opened the session with their latest updates, including preparations for the 2026 FIFA World Cup and progress on the Wrong-Way Vehicle Detection System. District Four followed with updates on the 95 Express Phase 3C Project and its First Responder Drive-Thru event on I-95.

The meeting also included updates from Florida

Highway Patrol-Troop E, Florida's Turnpike Enterprise, the Greater Miami Expressway Agency, the PortMiami Tunnel, the Golden Glades Interchange Enhancement Project, and the I-395/S.R. 836/I-95 Design-Build Project.

Sunshine Towing concluded the meeting by announcing that two South Florida Road Rangers, Mr. Jak Pereira and Mr. Jose Parra, were inducted into the International Towing Museum's Wall of the Fallen. Attendees observed a moment of silence in their honor and reaffirmed their commitment to responder safety.

District Four will host the next biannual meeting in spring 2026.


RISC STATS
